Accomplishments

We found 28 toads at the Bungle dam and the close by Ord river. We dissected 20 adults, of which 75% were infected with lungworm parasites. We saw a lot of freshwater crocodiles, Blue-tongue lizards and frogs, which could mean that toads have not yet caused much biodiversity losses in the Bungle Bungles area. We could not find any toads in the 'Blue Hole Yard'. We went by the Savannah mine; they have not found any toads since the one toad in April.

Comments

After visiting 'Blue Hole Yard', we heard from a road worker that toads were heard calling in the nearby creek, so not actually in the river. This location could be checked during a next visit. The western part of the Wilson river has never been checked for toads. However, the road to the river is very rough, so travel towards the Wilson river is hard. It would be good to go out on a quad bike to check this part of the river for toads, as it is suspected to be a frontline location.
